## Woodstock Inn & Resort, Woodstock, Vermont

The <u>Woodstock Inn & Resort</u>, nestled in New England's postcard-pretty Kedron Valley, is home to Kelly Way Gardens, where a mushroom glen, robust vegetable patch, and nutrient-dense superfoods provide a holistic food supply for the resort's restaurants.

Visits from May through October include gardening and flower-arranging workshops, barn dinners, and tomato tastings. Show-stopping garden displays evolve with the seasons. One autumn visit, I strolled through Gourdwalk, a tunnel where hanging gourds of every shape and size were like a natural cocoon.
